While there is no doubt that exposure to prenatal and postnatal trauma results in significant alterations in healthy brain development, there is now ample evidence that separation from the primary attachment figure as an intervention in all but the most high-risk situations, results in even greater and often irrevocable harm. This webinar series will provide an overview of key phases in brain development, the deleterious impact of trauma at each phase of development, the primacy of attachment and parental bonding, and offer alternative, phase-specific strategies to maintain, strengthen, and repair the maternal-child attachment bond in order to provide children the opportunity for recovery and healing within the family system.
